 $1.\hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A}$ Alt and tab used together cycle through the foreground applications. (If you do not know this you may be infested by weevils) 2. (Can be used in conjunction with item 3) 10. The help system is invoked using function key 1 (f1). (Yes, there is a help system, who would have believed it after all these years)
